Brandesburton Primary School Curriculum Intent



At Brandesburton Primary School, the curriculum is designed to recognise children's prior learning, provide first hand learning experiences, allow the children to develop interpersonal skills, build resilience and become creative, critical thinkers. We offer an engaging and inspiring curriculum that encourages an independent, life-long love of learning, both in school and beyond the classroom.

Our curriculum keeps us connected as a community of individuals whilst also embraces the community in which it is situated, recognising local history, heritage, geographical and business links. Most importantly, it also recognises the aspirations of all our children.

We place strong emphasis on the spiritual, moral, social and cultural development of all our pupils and our school community has identified a clear set of values that underpin expectations for behaviour for all members of our school community.

We use a Growth Mindset approach to promote positive attitudes to learning which reflect the values and skills needed to promote responsibility for learning and future success.
