



Art Week 2023

The final week of the previous half-term has seen the children of Brandesburton Primary School take part in our first annual art week. The children had an amazing week and have partaken in a range of arts based activities across the school linked to the national curriculum.

Foundation Stage

In foundation stage, the children have had a wonderful time completing autumnal and Halloween based activities to develop their artistic skills.



Class 1

In class 1, the children have spent the week drawing and painting. The children's art lessons have been linked to observational drawings and paintings of the local area. They spent time making observational drawings of the school grounds, identifying shapes to create detail. Moreover, the children developed their understanding of tone, thickness and colour mixing using a variety of mediums.

Class 2

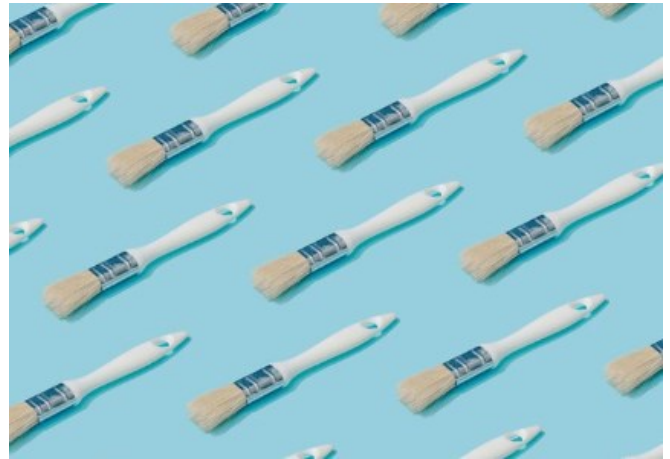
The children in class 2 also spent the week creating observational drawings and paintings. They really enjoyed experimenting with watercolours and oil pastels. Furthermore, the children found much enjoyment in the challenge of colour mixing to match items in the environment.





Class 3

In class 3, the children have created Greek Pottery. The children have developed their knowledge of manipulating malleable materials and creating surface patterns. They have also faced the tricky task of making joins and extending a base. Finally the children have painted their finished piece in true Greek style.



Class 4

In class 4, the children completed a drawing and painting unit focused on coastal and structural landscapes. To commence the unit they created an artist profile of Ian Mitchell followed by creating patterns and shape using pencil. Next, the children worked to improve their colour blending techniques using pencil crayons. The children had great fun learning how to create perspective in their art work. To finish they created their own coastal landscape painting.

Class 5

In class 5, the children have completed a unit based upon the work of Ian Mitchell, completing drawing and painting. The children learnt about perspective and experimented with dry media to create patterns and shape. Additionally, they created superb colour mixing and blending exemplars and with the knowledge gained created their own seascape paintings and a self-evaluation.



I think you will all agree that the children have done a great job with their art work and hopefully have come home each day of art week brimming with excitement to tell you all about their day.
