On Monday, we held our first ever Year Group Collaboration Meetings. All teachers met with other teachers from the same year group from different schools from HCAT. The morning was focused on sharing best practice. We loved having the opportunity to host (year 5 and 6 teachers) and for all staff to be part of collaboration and development.

To do this we must work alongside other professionals, to share good practice, explore new techniques and engage in that professional dialogue. 
Term Dates

We apologise over term dates, we are awaiting confirmation from the Local Authority for 2024/2025. Once we have these, we can share these with you.




Swimming
