Learning Theme

Beginning and end of the day

PE

PE will take place on a **Tuesday and Wednesday**. As in the Autumn term, please ensure that your child comes into school wearing their PE kit. PE kit consists of black shorts and a plain white t-shirt. However, in the winter months a warm PE kit is suggested which includes a plain black/dark hooded top and sports bottoms. It may also be beneficial to send in spare footwear dependent on the weather. No school uniform is to be worn for PE and in the interest of safety jewellery must not be worn, earrings must either be removed or taped and long hair must be tied back.

Homework

Homework tasks will usually be given on a Friday and should be completed by the following Thursday. If your child is struggling with their homework please ask them to come and see me prior to submission. Homework will be set using the Class blog, from here I will direct you to either Seesaw or Purplemash dependent on the task. Although it is beneficial to support your child with homework tasks, please ensure that the work is that of the child's and not your own.

<u>Reading</u>

Reading diaries need to be handed in on a Friday as books will be changed on this day. Please encourage your child to read as often as possible (even if this means repeating the book issued by school or an age appropriate book selected from home). Please ensure that an adult records the reading within the reading diary.

If you have any questions about anything at all, please do not hesitate to ask any of the Class 1 team. Once again, I am very much looking forward to the term ahead and teaching and supporting your child.
