

As writers...

Year 6 will start the new term by writing chronological reports about the Maya. During this unit they will be looking at making their writing cohesive and using a range of punctuation. The children will also be using the video: Alma (taken from the Literacy Shed) to create a five-part story looking at sustaining their writing standard for longer. Finally, they will also be looking at narrative poetry trying to understand how the poet uses vocabulary to create certain effects and tell the story.

As mathematicians...

Year 6 will be using the LTP of white Rose as a basis for learning. They will start this term looking at area and perimeter before moving onto statistics. From here they will also be focusing on algebra before finally looking at geometry which includes position and direction.

As PE experts...

This half term Year 6 will be focusing on the sports: tennis, athletics and cricket and the target sport Dodgeball. During all units they will learn the fundamentals of each sport before applying their skills to small sided games and competitions.

As historians...

Year 6 will be focusing on the Anglo Saxon civilisation. Who the Anglo Saxons were; where they came from; where they settled and what the consequences were of their invasion on England. The children will also learn about why they came to England and aspects of their daily life such as village life, housing and hierarchy. They will also be asked to compare the Anglo Saxons with the Ancient Maya who they have previously studied.

As geographers...

Year 6 will be completing a study of North America. Firstly, they will look at the human and physical features of the UK, before moving across and focusing on North America and the different countries within it. They will revisit topography, amongst other map skills, and conclude by writing an argument about the positive and negative impacts humans can have on a destination.

As ICT experts...

Year 6 will use the Purple Mash curriculum to focus on binary and networking. Binary will teach the children how to represent data and 0's and 1's and networking will teach the children about LAN and WAN and how the internet can be a useful tool both locally and in a wider sense.

As designers...

Year 6 will be focusing their skills on a food unit. They will plan, design, make and evaluate making dishes native to Mexico. They will research these dishes, select ingredients, before finally cooking them. From here they will be evaluating based on set criteria which they decide on.

As readers...

Year 6 will be looking in depth at the book *Boy in the Striped Pyjamas*. They will be exploring characters and the plot, working hard on inference and deduction and retrieval skills. We will also be looking at a wide range of non-fiction texts working on improving our summarising and explaining skills.

Year 6 will be focusing on the units Relationships and Citizenship.

Year 6 will be learning about Hopes and Visions – What is life about?

As scientists...

Year 6 will be focusing on Animals and Humans as well as Evolution. As a starting point the developing experts topics will be used as a basis for learning. The children will be asked to conduct research, experiment, test hypothesis, collect and analyse results.

As artists...

Year 6 will be carrying out an in-depth study into the artist Elizabeth Catlett. They will then take inspiration from their historical studies to design and create an Ancient Maya and an Anglo-Saxon inspired house (linking to their previous history unit). They will be required to display a number of design techniques to demonstrate the difference between these houses, including using skills such as rolling, coiling and adding texture.
