#### This Year

# **Important Information and Routines**

## Our Class Blog

#### **Home School Record Books**

In Key Stage 2, we have slightly different reading logs called 'Home School Record' Books. These are used to record reading, spellings, times tables, and anything else they need to remember. Feel free to write any messages to me if needed. We will always look at each log on a Friday but if your child gives me their log on another day, I will read any messages and get back to you as soon as possible.

#### Reading

In KS2, reading still remains a high priority. Please record reading daily in your child's home school record book. We would like to see at least 3 entries each week. All logs will be looked at on a Friday, but completed reading books can be changed any day of the week as long as it is recorded in the log with an adult signature. When reading, please ensure you complete inference and deduction questioning before, during and after reading to ensure your child has understood the text. Please contact me if you require any support with questions that you could ask your child. Let's all work together to achieve 100% of readers each week!

#### **Spellings**

As a school, we follow the Purple Mash spelling programme. Your child will be given spellings each week linked to a particular spelling pattern. Spellings will be written in your child's reading record, listed on the blog and they will also be able to access a quiz through Purple Mash each week. **Spellings will be tested and new ones issued each Tuesday.** 

### **Times Tables**

Times tables are a vital mathematical skill that need to be learnt. The children were expected to know their 2,5,10 times tables by the end of Year 2, then add their 3, 4 and 8 times tables by the end of Year 3 and all tables by the end of Year 4's will complete the Multiplication Check towards the end of the year so practice is very important (more details to follow later in the year) There are many games on Purple Mash and Times Table Rockstars to support this learning. Logins can be found in your child's reading log.

#### Homework

At the moment we will not be issuing any additional pieces of weekly homework as, we would like to see all the children concentrating on their reading, spelling and times tables to begin the year. However, as the year progresses we plan to add tasks and challenges to the blog for you to complete with your child. We will not be using seesaw in Class 3. If your child completes some work at home, please feel free to send it into school with them.

#### PΕ

Class 3 will be required to come to school in their PE kit on a Monday and a Wednesday – PE kit should be a white t-shirt, dark coloured shorts/tracksuit bottoms or leggings, a plain black or red hoody, school jumper or cardigan and trainers. As we will be outside, please also send your child with a clean pair of indoor shoes to change into afterwards.

#### Fruit

Now that your child is in KS2, they no longer get a free piece of fruit. However, you are welcome to send a piece of fruit for them to eat at playtime. Please keep the fruit in their book bag or lunch box as this will be the easiest way to store it.

#### Belongings

Please ensure your child has the following in school at all times; their red bag, their reading record and book, named water bottle and a coat if needed. It would be useful if the water bottle could come filled with fresh drinking water, as this will speed up systems in school. Water bottles will be sent home each night for washing. Please ensure all items are named.
